

30 Day FAP Plans

There are currently 2 of these plans available. The Home 1 Mbps 30D and Home 3 Mbps 30D. Please refer to the Skynet pricing guidelines for package and FAP token costs.

Some notes about the new 3GB 30 Day FAP plan:

- The Service provider recently introduced a new and improved Fair Access Policy that provides greater flexibility on data usage instead of the current 3 Day policy.
- The new FAP concept consists of data usage over 30 days instead of the current 3 Day FAP (72 hours) mechanism as per market demand.
- For example, on the new Home 3 Mbps 30 day plan (25GB allowance), subscribers are able to download as much or as little of the plan's data allowance as necessary at any given time over a rolling 30 day period
- Once a user has downloaded more than the allowance (25GB), the speed will be slowed to 64 Kbps.
- If the subscriber does not use the internet for the next 24 hours, the service will return to full speed until he downloads the next 833 MB in the next day. If he goes beyond 833MB, speed will be slowed to 64Kbps again for another 24 hours.
- User can activate a FAP reset token to be able to download another 25GB at full speed.
- Note: Data allowance does not "reset" at start of month, FAP is a rolling 30 day concept, not a 1st of Month to 30th of Month schedule.

Advantages	Disadvantages
User has flexibility to download up to 25GB in any one sitting or over any number of consecutive days	Once in FAP, and user does not use a FAP reset token, but continues to download at slow speed, he can stay in FAP state continuously
FAP reset token resets full 25GB again	Can only reset all 25GB at a time (no partial GB resets possible)
If in FAP, user can get out of FAP by not using the internet for 24 hours, and speed will be restored again after 24 hours	
If after going into FAP, user downloads less than 833MB per day, user will not go into FAP state.
